The chat session will be open for 30 minutes or so, and if there are more than enough people, we'll put you into smaller groups for a short time, where it's easier to have a conversation.

Someone will call you back with the information you will need.

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and lockdown, the Church of Scotland's annual General Assembly, which was due to take place at the Assembly Hall in Edinburgh from 16-22 May 2020, has been cancelled.

Although the full General Assembly cannot go forward, a special service will be held to formally install Rev Dr Martin Fair as the new Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

The full service will be streamed live on the Church of Scotland website:

In addition, a special online version of **Heart and Soul** will be streamed live on the same link from 2pm to around 4:20pm on Sunday 17 May. Heart and Soul 2020 will include highlights from the service to install the new Moderator, along with worship, conversation, music and all-age entertainment.


FOR OUR YOUNG MEMBERS (AND YOUNG AT HEART)
