A MESSAGE FROM THE FINANCE TEAM - please read and consider carefully

In the eighth chapter of 2 Corinthians we read about the grace that God gave to the early church in the midst of a severe trial. That grace led to overflowing joy and generosity. Later in the book we are reminded ch 9 v7, "Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

Our annual accounts have been submitted to Dundee Presbytery as normal, and we will update once feedback has been received. Things have changed greatly since our original financial forecast was prepared in March due to Covid-19: Income from the weekly collection plate and Hall lets has lapsed but we still have most of our expenditure commitments. We still pay Mission & Ministry contribution, essential maintenance, and utilities (energy plus telecom). Gas and electric bills are smaller as electrical appliances are off and heating is on 'frost protection'. Waste collections and regular cleaning contract are suspended, and our claims for gift aid are up to date to maximise cash-flow.

We know members may be struggling financially however, if you are able to respond, please consider:

1. Taking out a standing order, or regular BACS payment from your bank;
2. White envelopes: a) delivering your envelopes with **cheques** to the church or b) save on a weekly basis for when we return;
3. Make a one-off donation by BACS or cheque.

Remember that if you are a tax payer, Gift Aid is a simple way to help the church without costing you anything, many of the congregation are already registered for this.
