Every day I study this plant outside our window. Every day I look to see if it has grown any taller or if its flower buds are any bigger. Everyday there doesn't seem to be any change!

"This is what the Kingdom of God is like. A man scatters seed on the ground. Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how. All by itself the soil produces corn – first the stalk, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear". Mark 4:26-28

As believers we can quietly plod along in life, trusting that all the good we seek to do in co-operation with the Lord, and under his guidance, will eventually ripen into a product, something which is lasting, beautiful and true. You may have seen in the news that churches are now allowed to reopen in Scotland for Sunday Services.



On March 24th it was decided to postpone the Summer Olympics (Tokyo 2020) until next year, a disappointment to many athletes who had been training hard to compete. This brought to mind Eric Liddell honoured here in a panel from Scotland's Tapestry. Do you see the title "Champion of Conviction"?

Eric is perhaps best known for his refusal to compete in the heats for the 100m race at the 1924 Paris Olympics (the distance at which he excelled). Why? Because they were held on a Sunday, a day Eric viewed as set apart for the Lord, and he was true to his convictions rather than chasing fame. In fact as the guns were sounding to start that race Eric was preaching in a Paris church.

Instead he competed in the 400m during a weekday and won gold (finishing 5 metres ahead of the silver medallist!)

However Eric's convictions went beyond 'ought not's': he had a deep sense of God's purpose for his life. My favourite quote, from a scene in the film

Chariots of Fire, is "God made me fast. When I run, I feel His pleasure".
