
## FOR OUR YOUNG MEMBERS (AND YOUNG AT HEART)

The Bible tells a story in Matthew 8:23-27 about Jesus and his disciples getting caught in a raging storm. One night Jesus and the disciples decided to cross the sea in a boat. Jesus was very tired, so he lay down to take a nap while the boat sailed across to the other side. Suddenly, a great storm blew up. The wind blew, and the waves grew and splashed over the side of the boat. The disciples were afraid the boat would sink, so they woke Jesus and cried, "Don't you care that the boat is sinking?! Save us!" Jesus answered, "Why are you so afraid? What happened to your faith?" Jesus raised his arms and commanded the storm to be still. The winds stopped and the waves grew calm. The disciples were amazed by this. They looked at one another and asked, "Who is this man who could command the wind and waves, and they would obey him?"
