Wise words as we continue to seek ways to serve Him under the restrictions in place.


WORSHIP & RETURN TO CHURCH

Our Church will be open for worship at 11am on Sunday 6th September. We will be led by Rev. Anita Kerr. Don't worry if you decide to stay at home. There will be no website service this week but it will be back next week.

With last week's newsletter we sent two helpful information sheets which, hopefully, you will have read over. They are still available on our website www.logies.org.

Some of the main points to consider if you are intending to join us on Sunday are:

- You will need to wear a mask/face covering as you enter the building and throughout the service
- There will be no pew Bibles available
- Everyone will enter by the main door on Blackness Avenue. Please phone 0771 945 9836 in advance if you need disabled access.
- Aim to arrive about 15 minutes earlier than normal to help ensure we are all seated by 11am. You will be directed to where to sit.
- Be aware that you may have to wait outside in a socially distant manner – dress appropriately!
- NHS Scotland's 'Test and Protect' programme means we will need to take details of everyone who worships with us on Sunday.
- If you are in the habit of leaving a monetary donation please bring it in an envelope and drop it in the box provided; cheques would be preferable to cash.
