FOR OUR YOUNG MEMBERS (AND YOUNG AT HEART)

Are you sometimes just a little bit too chatty in class? Most of us find it is easy to talk to our friends and family, sometimes forgetting when to stop! But do you talk to God as easily? At some point in our church service each week we say The Lord's Prayer. It is the prayer that Jesus taught his disciples when they asked him how they should pray. It can be found in Luke 11. Most Christians know the prayer by heart. It forms a pattern for prayer.

- We bless God and pray for our world, our communities and our lives to be shaped by God's will;
- We pray for daily needs to be met,
- For forgiveness for wrongdoings, strength to resist temptation and protection from danger.

Another way to speak to God is to give each finger on your hand a topic, praying for similar things like we do when reciting the Lord's Prayer. Start with your thumb and work around your hand.
