Perhaps a good starting point for a thought for this week would be to ask, "Why does the church need to continue to provide worship events during this difficult time?" Fundamental characteristics of the church community have always been to worship God, to read scripture, to pray, to celebrate the Lord's Supper, and to minister to the needs of others. Heb 10:24 tells us to "consider how we may spur one another towards love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together as is the habit of some, but (to) encourage one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

It is now possible for us to hold two types of Sunday worship event each month. Since March, on-line webcast services were available for anyone with IT access to the website and, more recently, socially distanced, face-to-face services in the church building have been re-introduced for anyone able to attend. For those more restricted by illness or immobility or who may be shielding we hope that the weekly Church Newsletter and frequent telephone contacts are a source of encouragement and support. When government restrictions permit, we will also be ready to restart the Guild, Sunday Club and *Connect with a Cuppa*.

However, there is probably a need to develop an alternative type of church event. To create a less formal, more interactive meeting we have started a Tuesday evening event as a way of keeping in touch with each other and of nurturing our faith and our understanding of the Bible. The format includes a Bible reading, an explanation, and questions relating its meaning to everyday life. We split into small groups of 5-6 to share thoughts and ideas. Attendance is free and open to anyone with IT access.

Seven years ago, we considered the life of our church as being like a seedling with five leaves. It features in many places around the church (see Pat's banner photograph) and on church notices. If you remember, each leaf stands for a special activity we feel the church should be doing or providing. Two of these are *Nurture* and *Nourish*. As we think again about "church", wherever and however that can be experienced during this present difficult time, let's remember the importance of nurturing each other and of being nourished ourselves to strengthen our faith, maintain our hope and increase our capacity for love and good deeds.

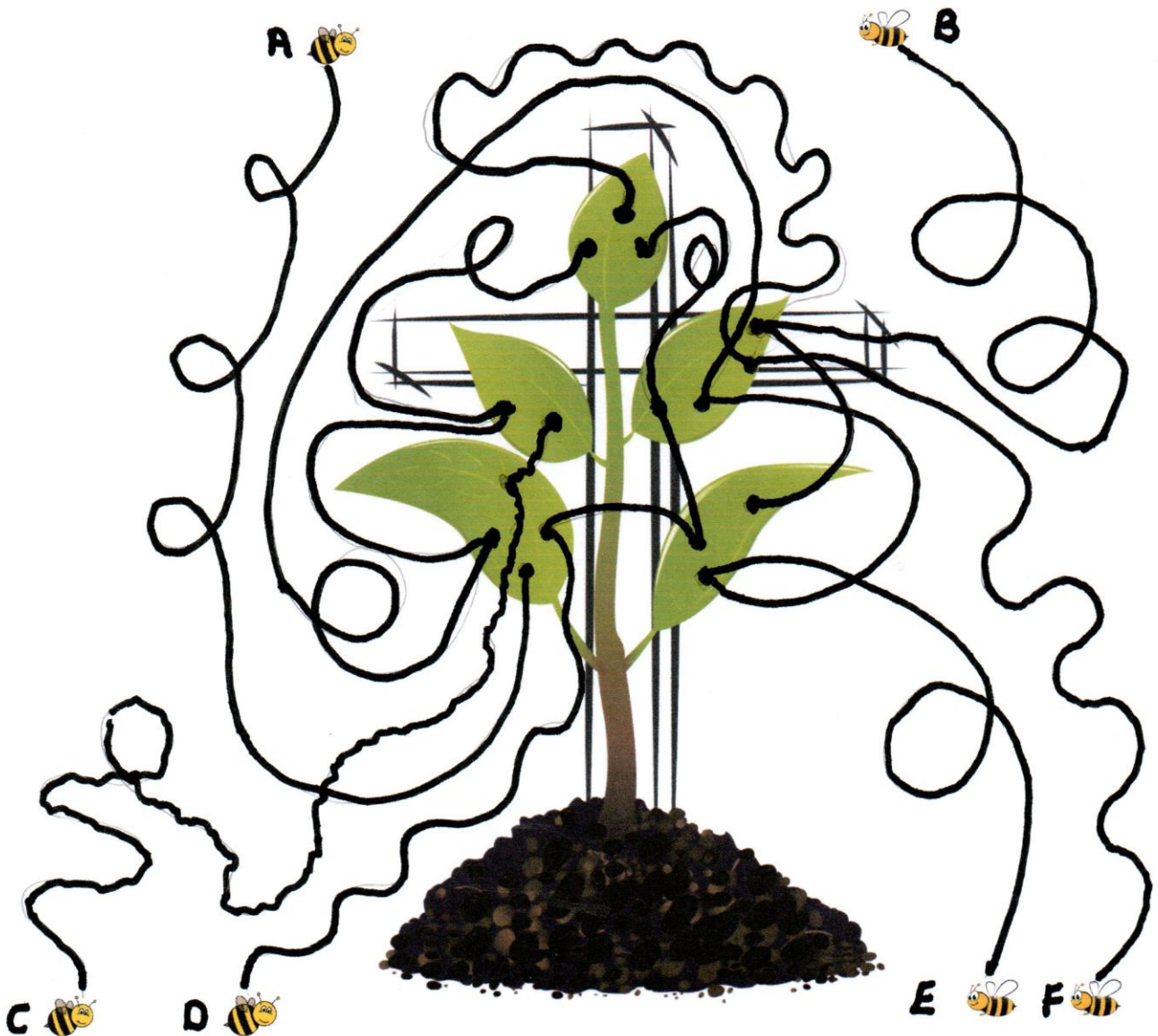
