It's the beginning of a new month and a new round of planning meetings for the UP, IN and OUT groups has started. The UP group met on Wednesday and the IN and OUT groups will follow shortly over the next two weeks.

The UP group reviewed the recent café style, all generation, church event which we had a few Sundays ago and, following all the positive feedback that was heard, are planning to hold another similar event in October focussing on Harvest and supporting one of the food banks.

Looking ahead to Autumn, we also considered the big question of how we individually, and as a congregation, can grow in faith as followers of Jesus. What can we do to help each other in this? As someone said, "Growing in faith is a choice" - something we either decide to do or decide not to do. In the next few weeks we will be sharing some ideas about this in church, based on the Tuesday evening events that have been taking place recently. We have been looking at the "one another" phrases found in the Bible. Eg, Love one another; live in harmony with one another; do not judge one another; pray for one another. We'll also be sharing information about various "helps" to learning more about the answers and applications of these life-style questions. Resources such as EXPLORE notes and SANCTUARY FIRST might be presented.

### **Spot the Differences: Joseph Helped the King**

Compare the picture on the top with the picture on bottom. Circle the 10 things that are different.



Over the last few Sundays Grant has been telling us about Joseph. Joseph's brothers sold him to be a slave in Egypt, but Joseph worked hard and Pharaoh gave him a very important job. One of his responsibilities was to take charge of food supplies when there was a famine in the country. This gave Joseph a chance to show kindness to his brothers and to forgive them.

This was all part of God's great plan. You can read about Joseph forgiving his brothers in Genesis 45: 1-11.

Can you spot 10 differences between the two pictures of Joseph controlling food supplies?
