CONNECT YOUTH




As we continue to think about how we are going to engage with our community, an exciting opportunity has arisen. We are going to be working in partnership with Connect Youth, an initiative which has been running from Menzieshill Parish Church for the last 10 years. Over the autumn, staff from Connect Youth will be undertaking research among young people who spend time in the West End. This will then lead to the development of Youth Work activities during November and December aimed at the young people who live around our church. This work has been made possible as we have been successful in securing a grant of £1250 from the Northwood Trust. Your prayers for this work would be very much appreciated.
