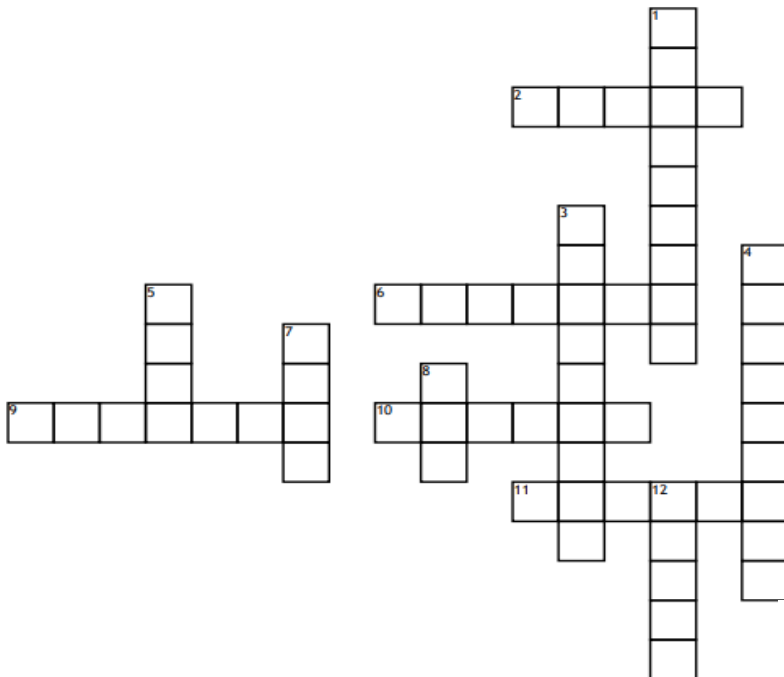
Current needs:

Tea, coffee, long life milk, cereals tinned meats and fish, packeted instant meals, quick cook pasta (Not lasagne), tinned soups, tinned rice, tinned fruit, cartons custard. Chocolate, treat bags/snacks for children (No individual biscuits/sweets), jars of jam, bottled squash, peanut butter, nappies, (assorted)
