PRESBYTERY PLAN UPDATE

As we continue to think through the future shape of the church in the Western area of Dundee The General Trustees of the Church of Scotland have outlined the process which will be undertaken with regards deciding the use of buildings.

They will work with the congregations of Logie & St John's (Cross) and Dundee: West to determine the alterations that each building needs to make them a well-equipped space in the right place and determine the cost of such alterations. They will also work with the two congregations to identify running costs and determine whether the buildings can be self-sustaining and finally they will also give advice on the value and marketability of each building with regards the sale of them.

It is important to note that no decision has yet been made about the use of either building in the future.
